Item No. 8: CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CALLING AND HOLDING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE COUNTY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OKLAHOMA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE REGISTERED QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF JACKSON COUNTY, THE QUESTION OF WHETHER THE RETAIL SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BY THE INDIVIDUAL DRINK FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION WILL BE AUTHORIZED WITHIN JACKSON COUNTY ON CHRISTMAS DAY, SUNDAYS, AND ON ANY DAY IN WHICH A NATIONAL, STATE, COUNTY OR CITY ELECTION, INCLUDING PRIMARY ELECTIONS, DURING THE HOURS THE POLLS ARE OPEN, BE PERMITTED BEGINNING JULY 1, 2018 AND NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION. EDC Director/Chamber of Commerce Director, Brian Bush explained that the current state law separates lower point beer and higher point beer and liquor. The current County Ordinance doesn't allow for the sale of higher point beer or liquor on particular days noted. In November 2016 the people voted on liquor laws and there will no longer be lower point beer sold. On October 1st new laws go into effect. There will be no sales of beer on Sunday in Jackson County after this date due to the County Ordinance that doesn't allow higher point alcoholic beverages to be sold on those days. 68% of Jackson County voters passed the State Question to change the current law. This change puts businesses in Jackson County at a disadvantage. The Chamber of Commerce does not want to lose businesses to other communities. He clarified he is not supporting or endorsing any positive language about the State Question, but believes the people of Jackson County should be able to vote on the matter. He asked that the Board approves the Resolution to authorize the election take place on the same day as the primary election so there will be no additional elections costs to the County. This will also be helpful as the law will go into effect before the November election. He clarified at the request of Vice-Chairman Butler that there is no additional cost to the County. It would be included in the same fees that the County must pay every primary and general election regardless of whether or not there are candidates or propositions on the ballot. A Motion was made by Butler, seconded by Clinton to approve Resolution 2018-23 authorizing the calling and holding of a special election in the County of Jackson, State of Oklahoma, for the purpose of submitting to the registered qualified electors of Jackson County, the question of whether the retail sale of alcoholic beverages by the individual drink for on-premises consumption will be authorized within Jackson County on Christmas Day, Sundays, and on any day in which a national, state, county or city election, including primary elections, during the hours the polls are open, be permitted beginning July 1, 2018 and Notice of Special Election.
